Construction – the default is no, unless one of the exceptions exists.		✓	<p><u>Construction Exceptions:</u></p> <p><u>Projects Already Underway</u></p> <p>Projects already underway involving individual single-family homes, or an individual apartment unit where an individual already resides, with a construction crew of 5 or fewer individuals. This includes additions to single-family homes such as solar panels. Projects already underway involving a residential unit for which a tenant or buyer has already entered into a legally binding agreement to occupy the unit by a certain date, and construction is necessary to ensure the unit's availability by that date.</p> <p><u>Critical Business Functions</u></p> <p>Projects involving data centers or facilities that are critical to a business's ability to function.</p>

		<p><u>Emergency Repairs</u></p> <p>Any emergency repairs necessary to ensure the health and safety of residents.</p> <p><u>Facilities</u></p> <p>Projects involving facilities at which any one or more of the following takes place: the manufacture, distribution, storage, or servicing of goods or products that are sold by online retail businesses or essential retail businesses, as defined by EO 107 and subsequent Administrative Orders adopted pursuant to that Order.</p> <p><u>Government</u></p> <p>Any project that is ordered or contracted for by Federal, State, county, or municipal government, or any project that must be completed to meet a deadline established by the Federal government.</p> <p><u>Health Care</u></p> <p>Projects necessary for the delivery of health care services, including but not limited to hospitals, other health care facilities, and pharmaceutical manufacturing facilities.</p> <p><u>Law Enforcement Support</u></p> <p>Any project necessary to support law enforcement agencies or first responder units in their response to the COVID-19 emergency.</p> <p><u>Residential Affordable Projects</u></p> <p>Residential projects that are exclusively designated as affordable housing.</p> <p><u>Safety</u></p> <p>Any work on a non-essential construction project that is required to physically secure the site of the project,</p>

			<p>ensure the structural integrity of any buildings on the site, abate any hazards that would exist on the site if the construction were to remain in its current condition, remediate a site, or otherwise ensure that the site and any buildings therein are appropriately protected and safe during the suspension of the project.</p> <p><u>Schools (Pre-K to 12)</u></p> <p>Projects involving pre-K-12 schools, including but not limited to projects in Schools Development Authority districts, and projects involving higher education facilities.</p> <p><u>Transportation Projects</u></p> <p>Transportation projects, including roads, bridges, and mass transit facilities or physical infrastructure, including work done at airports or seaports.</p> <p><u>Utility Projects</u></p> <p>Utility projects, including those necessary for energy and electricity production and transmission, and any decommissioning of facilities used for electricity generation.</p>
