#2024-26 RESOLUTION SUPPORTING OPRA REFORM WHEREAS, the New Jersey Open Public Records Act ("OPRA") as currently constituted has been abused by commercial enterprises as a mechanism for commercial purposes; and WHEREAS, OPRA has become an expensive mandate upon municipalities resulting in significant unbudgeted legal and administrative costs, especially in small municipalities with only one records officer, which legal and administrative costs are a burden to taxpayers; and WHEREAS, the mandatory fee shifting provisions in OPRA are a burden to taxpayers; and, WHEREAS, municipalities should be able to recover legal and administrative costs for broad or frivolous OPRA requests; and, WHEREAS, in some instances OPRA is often used as a sword to burden local governments and political leaders to exert leverage in connection with political or controversial issues and litigation; and WHEREAS, in some instances OPRA has resulted in the loss of privacy of residents and local officials when conducting public business; and WHEREAS, the State Privacy Study Commission has made recommendations with regard to OPRA reform; and WHEREAS, there is currently pending before the Legislature Assembly Bill A-4045 and Senate Bill 2930 implementing OPRA reform; and NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Frelinghuysen Township Committee requests New Jersey State Legislature adopt OPRA reform as set forth in Assembly Bill A-4045 and Senate Bill 2930, and that after said adoption, New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy quickly sign OPRA reform into law effective to all OPRA requests pending or outstanding on the date of enactment. A copy of this Resolution shall be distributed to the Office of the Governor, the Senate President, the Speaker of the Assembly, and the 23rd and 24th Legislative District.

ORDINANCES:

#2024-02 AMENDING SECTION 2-11.4 OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FRELINGHUYSEN CODE CONCERNING THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE TOWNSHIP CLERK WHEREAS, the Section 2-11.4 of the Township of Frelinghuysen Code specifies the powers and duties of the Township Clerk; and WHEREAS, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:9-133(e)(7) provides that a municipal clerk shall perform such duties as are imposed by statute, ordinance or regulation; and WHEREAS, it is necessary and appropriate to amend that section to reflect duties necessary for the Township's operations, and which are to be performed by the Township Clerk. NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen, County of Warren, State of New Jersey, as follows: <u>Section I</u> Section 2-11.4 of the Township of Frelinghuysen Code, is amended to read as follows (additions are boldfaced, deletions are stricken through): <u>§ 2-11.4. Powers and Duties</u> Specified. The Township Clerk shall:...g. Serve as the Assessment Search Officer; h, Serve as the Secretary to the Board of Health; i. Serve as the Safety Director, and j.g. Perform such other duties as are now or hereafter imposed by statute, regulation or by municipal ordinance or regulation. Section II

1. Each clause, section or subsection of this ordinance shall be deemed a separate provision to the intent that if any such clause, section or subsection should be declared invalid, the remainder of the ordinance shall not be affected.

2. All ordinances or parts of ordinance inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed as to the extent of such inconsistency.

3. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days following final passage, approval, and publication as required by law. Mr. Ramos also mentioned the passing of Clint Poyer on March 8, 2024. On behalf of the Township Committee, and gave his heartfelt condolences to his wife, Doris Poyer, friends, and family during this difficult time.
- Deputy Mayor Stracco nothing to report
- Committeeman McPeek nothing to report
- Committeewoman Natyzek discussed the Easter egg hunt on Saturday the 23rd of March @ 10am put on through the Recreation Committee. She let the committee and public know that the environmental commission Chair, Dave Paust has put up blue bird houses in the area next to the ball fields.
- Committeeman Stock nothing to report
- Attorney Rich Beilin discussed the affordable housing law that was signed by the Governor and explained that it does away with all in the past. He explained that from now to December the DCA will issue numbers for each municipality and with that he explained the town can adopt own numbers, reject the state's numbers, and if adopting own numbers then ca be objective and discussed having to adopt a housing plan. He also discussed affordable housing for rental properties and more information is coming on that. He mentioned penalties staying the same as in the past and still having the risk of lawsuits from builders plans. He will update the Committee as more information comes out.
- Municipal Clerk Zilberfarb Thanked the Committee members for preparing and passing the resolution for support of the OPRA pending changes in legislation.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Appointment for the Warren County Municipal Charitable conservancy Trust Committee person was made with a motion by Mr. McPeek to concur with the appointment of Scott Lance, seconded by Mr. Stock. All were in favor of said appointment.
- Motion was made by Mr. McPeek to accept Heather Hasselmann's resignation from the Recreation Committee with regrets, seconded by Mr. Stock. All were in favor. This is effective March 20, 2024.
- Motion was made by Mr. Stock to accept the retirement of Alan DeCarolis, ACO, with regrets, seconded by Mr. McPeek. All were in favor and thanked Mr. DeCarolis for all his years of service.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

Motion was made by Mr. McPeek for a consent agenda for department reports 1-15, seconded by Mr. Stock. All present were in favor. Chief Ortiz discussed the fire department report and spoke of the 6 calls since March 1st and mentioned their fundraiser for Cinco de Mayo on May 4th.

OPEN MEETING TO THE PUBLIC:

Motion was made by Mr. McPeek, seconded by Mr. Stock limiting it to 20 minutes to open meeting to the public. All were in favor. Spoke were:

- Loren Greco asked what General Code was on the bills list and what the charge for Blairstown Agway of \$9,000 was for? Ms. Zilberfarb explained General Code was the town's codification company and that the \$9,000 was a typo and the amount was \$127.00.
- Anthony Alleyne asked the committee if they had thoughts on the packet that was sent to the Attorney and the Committee members. Mr. Beilin explained that he did review it and it was a legal case and could not discuss in public session. Mr. Beilin asked to speak with him after the meeting.
- Kirk Perez discussed living in this town and that he is worried about inappropriate building and asked if there were any ordinances in place to protect the town. Mr. Ramos explained the Master Plan and that it is online and that he should take a look at it. Mr. Stracco explained that the vast majority of the town is AR6 zone, 6 acre minimum zoning and that there are few that are different and is in the Master Plan. Mr. Perez spoke of warehouse signs and how towns weren't prepared for them and wanted to make sure that our town is prepared. He thanked the committee for their time.
- Mr. Alleyne asked about Senior Housing and Mr. Ramos explained that they still would need to go through the entire process and even if the owner puts up a sign for senior housing they still need to go through the process.
- Dan Kohuth asked about the Town of Belvidere, Precision Tree and Universal Technical Services invoices on the bills list. The Town of Belvidere was for shared court services, Mr. Mcpeek explained the Precision Tree and Ms. Zilberfarb explained that Universal Technical Services is the new Engineer for the Land Use Board.
- Mr. Kohuth stated there was no tracking cookies option to reject cookies on the website page.
- Mr. Kohuth stated that it is a disservice doing a consent agenda for department reports. Mr. Ramos explained consent agendas and how the committee can pull a report and discuss if they'd like.
- Mr. Kohuth also asked why all the equipment is parked outside. Mr. Ramos explained that they are working on things and will be taken care of.
