PROCLAMATION:

PROCLAMATION IN HONOR OF RICHARD "RICK" MURPHY WHEREAS, Richard "Rick" Murphy has been a longtime resident of Frelinghuysen Township, and resides at 100 Lanning Road in the Township; WHEREAS, in 2002 a 245 acre farm along Kerrs Corner Road in the Township, was proposed as the location of a major residential subdivision; and WHEREAS the proposed subdivision, known as ABD Major Subdivision was presented to the Frelinghuysen Township Planning Board in 2002; and WHEREAS, the subdivision plan presented would have created 49 new houses and 5 new roads in the Township; and WHEREAS, the farm, now known as Murlan Farm, was historically, a dairy farm; and WHEREAS, the area surrounding Kerrs Corner Road was and remains, a very rural and agricultural area in the Township; and WHEREAS, a significant subdivision in this location was not considered desirable as it would have permanently changed the rural agrarian character of Kerrs Corner Road and this section of the Township; and WHEREAS, at the time, Mayor Rydell was concerned about the impact of the proposed subdivision and approached resident Rick Murphy of Lanning Road about his potential to assist by acquiring the farm, to prevent a residential subdivision in this location; and WHEREAS, Rick Murphy agreed to help, and acquired the farm for \$2,100,000 in September of 2003, to prevent it being owned and subdivided by a developer; and WHEREAS. Rick Murphy also invested significantly in the restoration of a magnificent, large and historic dairy barn on the property; and WHEREAS, the farm has been held and worked as a farm, and protected from development for eighteen years by Rick Murphy; and WHEREAS, on March 17th, 2021, Murlan Farm was officially entered into the farmland preservation program, thanks to Rick Murphy, and with the assistance of The Land Conservancy of New Jersey, the Warren County Farmland Preservation Program, and the State Agriculture Development Committee; and WHEREAS, 224 acres of Murlan Farm are now permanently protected from development and will always be retained for agriculture; and WHEREAS, Rick Murphy also entered his 204 acre farm on Lanning Road in the Township into the farmland preservation program on January 24th of 2018; and WHEREAS, thanks to the conservation efforts of Rick Murphy, approximately 428 acres of farmland in Frelinghuysen Township are now preserved and will forever be retained for agriculture; and WHEREAS, when the Township was looking for assistance, and he was called on by the Mayor to help, Rick Murphy stepped up and at significant personal expense, literally saved the farm; and WHEREAS, the Township of Frelinghuysen is extremely grateful to Rick Murphy for his assistance in protecting so many acres of productive agricultural land, and, NOW, THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED on this 19th day of May, 2021, by the Frelinghuysen Township Committee, on behalf of the residents of the Township of Frelinghuysen, that we hereby convey our deepest and best appreciation to Rick Murphy for his contributions to preserving agricultural land in the Township, and for the betterment of our Township community, and wish the best of luck to him in all of his future endeavors. ORDINANCES:

#2021-06 ORDINANCE OF THE FRELINGHUYSEN TOWNSHIP MAYOR AND COMMITTEE REVISING SECTION 2-25.1, ET SEQ. OF THE FRELINGHUYSEN TOWNSHIP CODE, ENTITLED "INTERMUNICIPAL COURT" WHEREAS, the Township of Frelinghuysen has withdrawn from the Municipal Court of Knowlton Township and has entered into an Interlocal Services Agreement with the Town of Belvidere for the shared location and operation of the Town of Belvidere's municipal court facilities; and WHEREAS, the current provisions of the Frelinghuysen Township Code concerning the intermunicipal court must be amended consistent with this Shared Services Agreement. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Frelinghuysen, County of Warren, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section I

Sections 2-25.1 through 2-25.4 of the Frelinghuysen Township Code are deleted in their entirety and replaced with the following: § 2-25.1. Court Established; Name. A Municipal Court is hereby established under the authority of N.J.S.A. 2B:12-1 et seq. and N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, et seq. The name of the Court shall be the "Municipal Court of the Township of Frelinghuysen" and the operations of the Court shall be governed by the said statutes and by a certain "Shared Services Agreement for Shared Municipal Court Between the Township of Frelinghuysen and the Town of Belvidere" (referred to in Sections 2-25.1 through 2-25.8 as the "Municipal Court Shared Services Agreement"), as may be amended from time to time. § 2-25.2. Jurisdiction. The Municipal Court established in this chapter shall have and exercise the limited civil and criminal jurisdiction prescribed by N.J.S.A. 2B:12-1 et seq. § 2-25.3. Clerk; other assistants. The parties to the Municipal Court Shared Services Agreement may provide for a clerk and other necessary clerical and other assistants for the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township pursuant to the terms of the Municipal Court Shared Services Agreement. § 2-25.4. Judge. The Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township shall have a Judge who shall be known as the "Judge of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township." The Judge shall be appointed pursuant to the terms of the Municipal Court Shared Services Agreement. § 2-25.5. Compensation of Judge and assistants. A. The compensation of the Judge of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township shall be governed by the Municipal Court Shared Services Agreement. B. The compensation of the clerk, clerical and other assistants of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township shall be governed by the Municipal Court Shared Services Agreement. § 2-25.6. Prosecutor. Α. The Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township shall have a prosecutor who shall be known as the "Prosecutor of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township." He shall be appointed pursuant to the terms of the Municipal Court Shared Services Agreement and shall be an attorney at law pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2B:12-27. B. The Clerk of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township shall advise the Chief of the Prosecutors and Police Bureau, Division of Criminal Justice, Department of Law and Public Safety of the State of New Jersey on an annual basis of: (1) The name of the individual appointed as Prosecutor of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township; (2) The name of any other individual appointed to serve as an assistant or deputy to the Prosecutor of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township; (3) A copy of the resolution making the appointment; and (4) A complete mailing address of the Prosecutor of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township, including a telephone number and facsimile transmission number. § 2-25.7. Public Defender of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township; appointment, duties and compensation. A. Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township shall have a Public Defender of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township. The Public Defender of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township shall be appointed pursuant to the terms of the Municipal Court Shared Services Agreement. B. The Public Defender of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township shall be compensated pursuant to the terms of the Municipal Court Shared Services Agreement. C. The Public Defender of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township appointed hereunder shall perform the duties set forth at N.J.S.A. 2B:24-6, as well as any other duties now or hereafter required by law. § 2-25.8. **Application for representation; fee.** Any person applying for representation by a Public Defender before the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township or for court-approved

counsel shall pay an application fee as established by the Judge of the Municipal Court of Frelinghuysen Township, provided that such amount shall not exceed the amount necessary to pay the cost of the Public Defender's services. **Section II** 1. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency. 2. If any word, phrase, clause, section or provision of this ordinance shall be found by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, illegal or unconstitutional, such word, phrase, clause, section, or provision shall be severable from the balance of the ordinance and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. 3. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law. Motion was made by Mr. Ramos to open for first reading for introduction, seconded by Mr. McPeek. #2021 – 07 Ordinance To Amend Chapter 21 of the Code of the Township of Frelinghuysen to Reflect Amendments Requested by the County of Warren Planning Department Following a Review of Ordinance No. 2020-14, Which Was Adopted by the Township Committee on December 16, 2020 WHEREAS, the Township of Frelinghuysen adopted an updated Stormwater Control Ordinance on December 16, 2020 in compliance with amendments to the Stormwater Management Rules pursuant to the requirements in N.J.A.C. 7:8; and WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2020-14 was sent to the County Planning Department for review as required under the rules; and WHEREAS, the County Planning Department issued comments on Ordinance 2020-14 as part of its review and approval of said ordinance; and WHEREAS, the Township of Frelinghuysen proposes the following amendments to Chapter 21 of the Code entitled "Stormwater Control" to address the County Planning Department's review comments:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FRELINGHUYSEN, COUNTY OF WARREN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY THAT CHAPTER 21 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF FRELINGHUYSEN, ENTITLED "STORMWATER CONTROL", IS AMENDED AS FOLLOWS: **Section One** - The definition of "County review agency" in Section 21-2 is hereby revised as follows: "County review agency" means an agency designated by the Board of County Commissioners to review municipal stormwater management plans and implementing ordinance(s). The county review agency may either be:

- 1. A county planning agency; or
- A county water resource association created under N.J.S.A 58:16A-55.5, if the
 ordinance or resolution delegates authority to approve, conditionally approve, or
 disapprove municipal stormwater management plans and implementing
 ordinances.

Section Two - The definition of "Major development" in Section 21-2 is hereby amended to read as follows: "Major development" means an individual "development," as well as multiple developments that individually or collectively result in:

- 1. The disturbance of one or more acres of land since February 2, 2004;
- 2. The creation of one-quarter acre or more of "regulated impervious surface" since February 2, 2004;
- 3. The creation of one-quarter acre or more of "regulated motor vehicle surface" since March 2, 2021; or
- 4. A combination of 2 and 3 above that totals an area of one-quarter acre or more. The same surface shall not be counted twice when determining if the combination area equals one-quarter acre or more.

Major development includes all developments that are part of a common plan of development or sale (for example, phased residential development) that collectively or individually meet any one or more of paragraphs 1, 2, 3, or 4 above. Projects undertaken by any government agency that otherwise meet the definition of "major development" but which do not require approval under the Municipal Land Use Law, N.J.S.A. 40:55D-1 et seq., are also considered "major development."

Section Three - The definition of "New Jersey Stormwater Best Management Practices (BMP) Manual" in Section 21-2 is hereby amended to read as follows: "New Jersey Stormwater Best Management Practices (BMP) Manual" or "BMP Manual" means the manual maintained by the Department providing, in part, design specifications, removal rates, calculation methods, and soil testing procedures approved by the Department as being capable of contributing to the achievement of the stormwater management standards specified in this chapter. The BMP Manual is periodically amended by the Department as necessary to provide design specifications on additional best management practices and new information on already included practices reflecting the best available current information regarding the particular practice and the Department's determination as to the ability of that best management practice to contribute to compliance with the standards contained in this chapter. Alternative stormwater management measures, removal rates, or calculation methods may be utilized, subject to any limitations specified in this chapter, provided the design engineer demonstrates to the municipality, in accordance with Section 21-4F of this ordinance and N.J.A.C. 7:8-5.2(g), that the proposed measure and its design will contribute to achievement of the design and performance standards established by this chapter.

Section Four - Table 1 in Section 21-4F is hereby amended to denote an entry for the minimum separation from seasonal high water table for cisterns as follows:

#2021-51 RESOLUTION OPPOSING CUTS IN STATE SCHOOL AID ALLOCATIONS TO THE TOWNSHIP OF FRELINGHUYSEN. COUNTY OF WARREN. ELEMENTARY SCHOOL AND SENDING DISTRICTS WHEREAS, The Fiscal Year 2022 K-12 State School Aid amounts have been released by the New Jersey Department of Education, Office of School Finance; and WHEREAS, only 8 of Warren County's 23 school districts are receiving funding increases, while the remaining 15 districts will see dramatic cuts to their state school aid, with most of them receiving double-digit decreases; and WHEREAS, the state school aid decreases for FY 2022 in the Township of Frelinghuysen, County of Warren are as follows: Frelinghuysen Township: -21.55% North Warren Regional: -25.77% WHEREAS the Township of Frelinghuysen Township Committee finds these decreases to be detrimental to our Townships school districts and will hinder their ability to provide the high quality of education that our students deserve.
